For Young People

- To support the physical and emotional wellbeing of young people who play badminton
- To listen to young people and empower them to have a voice
- To send a positive message to your membership that young people matter in your club

For Adults

- To let parents know they're choosing the right club for their young people
- To support the coaching team of your club

Compliance

- To comply with Badminton England's safeguarding Young People policy
- To be Clubmark compliant - a safe, inclusive and welcoming badminton club

The Welfare Officer will:

- Be safeguarding aware
- Ensure that safeguarding is on the agenda for your club and your club membership
- Ensure all those working with young people in the club are aware of their responsibilities
- Be a positive role model in the club and encourage others around you to be the same
- Have direct contact with Badminton England and / or your county Badminton Association where issues/concerns arise
